

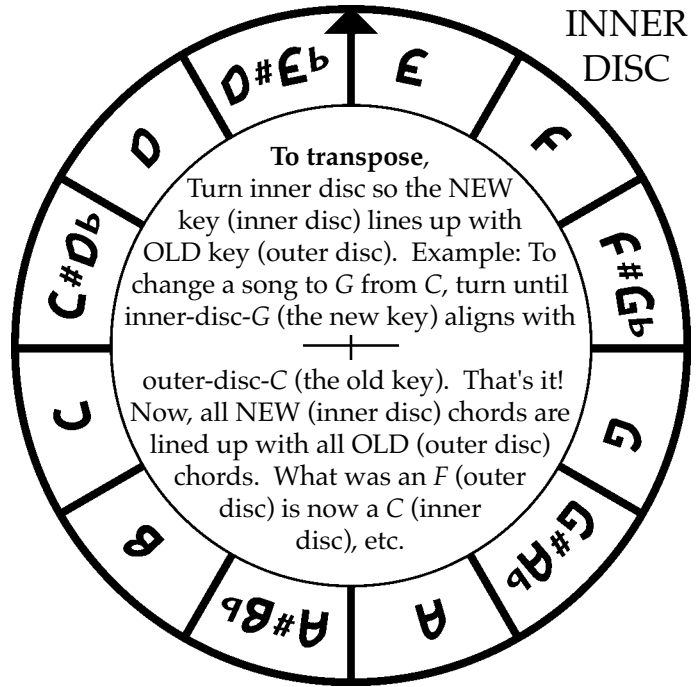
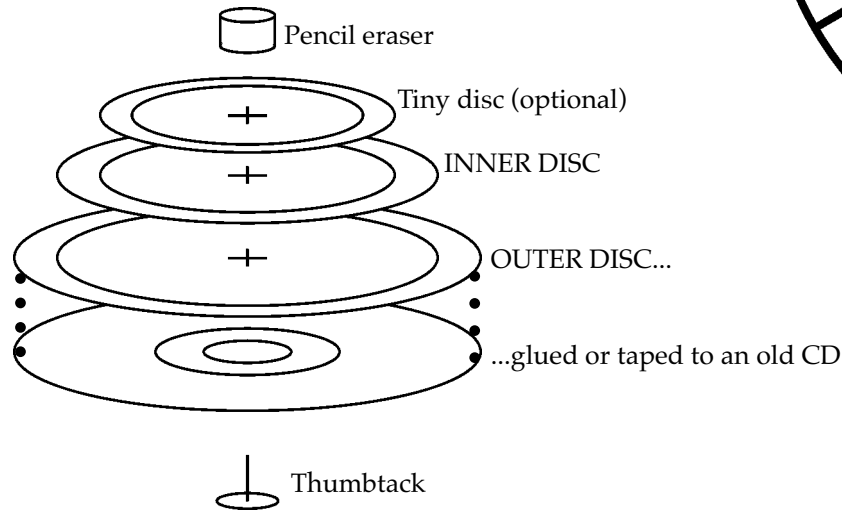


**Whither Zither Transposing Disc and Capo Guru.**

The web is full of such wheeled info-gizmos as this. They are fun to invent and adapt to your own needs.

**Construction:**

1. For best results, print onto card stock.
2. Cut out the discs (the littlest one is optional).
3. **Glue or tape** the big "outer" disc to an old CD.
4. Push a thumb tack up through all the centers as shown, and cap with a pencil eraser.



**To use as Capo Guru:**

Tiny numbers on outer-disc indicate frets. Turn inner disc so its little arrow points to the fret where you have put your capo. Now, the common fingerings for the inner-disc-chords will actually create the corresponding outer-disc-chords. (Arrow on outer disc is just there to indicate the no-capo situation).

**Example 1:** If capo is on fret 2, point inner-disc-arrow to the number 2. This indicates that with a C fingering you will hear a D chord, as shown on outer disc.

**Example 2:** If you only know how to finger in G, and have to play a song in B, turn the G on the inner disc to the B on the outer disc, and note what number the inner disc's arrow is pointing at. (In this example, the 4.) Move your capo to fret 4. Now when you play your song with G fingering, you will be in the key of B.
